HSHC Papers of Helen Sophia Heath Clark 1727-1990s

ADMINISTRATIVE AND BIOGRAPHICAL HISTORY

Helen Sophia Heath Horne Clark (1900-1997) was the daughter of Francis Percy Horne (1870-1960), journalist, and Alice Drewett Horne (1868-1924) (she had one sister Edith Gulielma S Horne). Brought up in India, where her father was the editor of the *Bombay Guardian*, in 1929 she married Roderic Kendall Clark (1884-1937).

Roderic's father James Edmund Clark was the 11th child of James Clark (1811-1906), founder of the Clarks shoe manufacturing business in Street, Somerset, and his wife Eleanor Stephens Clark (1812-1879). Roderic was educated at Ackworth and Bootham, and then studied at UCL and King's College, Cambridge. He spent some time at a Quaker drapery business in Thirsk and in Montreal, 1907-1908. During World War One, he was put on trial as a conscientious objector, where his sentences added up to a two year period. He also spent two years post WW1 undertaking Quaker relief work in France and Germany. In 1912 Roderic became a director of Brangwin Clark and Co which had been founded in 1897. The company was dissolved in 1921 and was immediately reformed by Roderic as Clark Brangwin and Co using Clark family finances. He set up new offices at 'Friendly House', 21-23 Chiswell Street, London. He held the position of CEO until his death in November 1937, after which the firm continued in non-family hands until it was sold c 1950 by Helen Clark.

Roderic married Helen on 8 June 1929 and the couple set up home at 97 Palace Road, Tulse Hill, London. Roderic and HSHC had three children, Edmund Kendall Clark (1930-), John Horne Clark (1933-) and Ann Clark (1933-1933). Following the death of Roderic, Helen initially remained in London with her children and her father until the outbreak of WW2, later making a home for a short time in Shipham near Winscombe.

James Edmund Clark (1850-1944) and Lucretia Hasseltine Kendall (1853-1937) had married in Boston, USA, in 1879. James Edmund Clark was educated at Bootham School and Flouders College, and took a BA at University College London. He then became a science schoolmaster at Bootham School, York for many years (where his brother in law Fielden Thorp was headmaster) until his early retirement in 1897 due to hearing problems. During his time at Bootham he studied natural science at the University of Heidelberg where he met his wife to be. He was a founding editor of the *Natural History Journal* and a Fellow of the Geological Society of London. His scientific interests centred on glacial geology, meteorology and phenology. On his retirement he applied unsuccessfully for the post of headmaster of Leighton Park and instead became a partner as a Colonial and Eastern exporter in London. The couple retired from Purley to Street in 1929 and resided at Burleigh Redroofs, Portway. Following the death of James Edmund Clark, the house became the family home of HSHC until her death in 1997.

ARCHIVAL HISTORY

Deposited by Kendall Clark and John Horne Clark in 1997 following the death of their mother HSHC, mainly from her home at Burleigh Redroofs. Some papers are previously thought to have been housed at Greenbank: James Edmund Clark was involved in clearing the property following the death of his sister Sophia Sturge Clark in 1933, since he was the only surviving child of James and Eleanor Clark.

DESCRIPTION

As well as including the papers of Helen 'Sophia' Heath Clark, the collection also contains papers relating to immediate members of the Clark family, in particular her husband Roderic, but also including her grandparents-in-law James and Eleanor Clark; her father-in-law James Edmund and his sisters; her son John Horne Clark; her mother-in-law Lucretia Hasseltine Kendall Clark; her brother-in-law William Stephens Clark. Also papers relating to the Horne, Drewitt, Kendall and Stephens families; publications, newspapers and journals.
